M.Donnelly Interprovincial Wheelchair Hurling League - Round 4

Boyle Sports Complex in County Roscommon plays host to the fourth round of the M.Donnelly GAA Interprovincial Wheelchair Hurling League on Saturday 9th September 2023. It will be the second time that an All-Ireland Wheelchair Hurling event will be hosted in Co. Roscommon, having previously being held in 2016 in the same venue. The Connacht GAA Health & Wellbeing and Games for All Committee under the chairmanship of Mattie Kilroy will be responsible for co-ordinating this Wheelchair Hurling Interprovincial event in Roscommon.

Connacht GAA Council are sponsors of this event which sees teams and players travelling from Ulster, Munster and Leinster as well as Connacht, competing in this National Competition.

The Interprovincial Wheelchair Hurling League and Championships were formed in 2014 and provide a competitive sporting environment for wheelchair users. The competition has gone from strength to strength in the past 10 seasons with the Provincial Councils providing the platform for the players to compete.

This is the fourth round of the League with the finals of the competition scheduled for Saturday 21st October in SETU, Carlow.

What is Wheelchair Hurling?

Answer - Ground hurling, played by Wheelchair users.

How old is the sport?

Wheelchair hurling was 'invented' in 1998 in a Dublin Special Needs school, by school Principal, Tim Maher.

How many players are involved?

Teams are 6 a side, made up of: 2 Forwards, 1 Midfielder, 2 Backs and 1 Goal keeper.

Does the game have zones?

Yes, there are three zones.

- 1) Attackers and Defenders must stay in their appropriate
- 2) Midfielders can travel in both the attacking and defensive zones.
- 3) The Goal keepers are the only players allowed in the goal keeping zones.

International Floorball Tournament



The Irish Wheelchair hurling team flew out from Dublin airport to compete in the 2023 at the International Floorball Tournament in Prague which took place from the 9th to the 12th August.

The 12-person panel was made up of wheelchair hurlers from each of the four provinces, and the team represented the GAA in the competition against Floorball teams from the Czech Republic, The Netherlands, Sweden, and Switzerland. The team which was sponsored MyClubShop.ie, owned by long-standing wheelchair hurling sponsor Martin Donnelly and is captained by Limerick Paralympian, James McCarthy. The squad was:

Floorball is a game being considered for addition to the list of sports in the Paralympics. It differs from wheelchair hurling in that players play on a field and use a stick, like those used in ice hockey. The invitation to play in Prague, offered a chance to some of our very best players the opportunity, to not only compete at a very high level, but to represent their families, their clubs, their counties and our Association, on the international stage.

The Irish hurlers were very much underdogs at the Para Games Floorball International event as they had to adjust to a sport that differs somewhat to wheelchair hurling. The sticks and balls used are different to their hurleys and sliotars, and, unlike in wheelchair hurling when you can contest for the ball in the air and palm it down with your hand, in Floorball you can't bring the stick above the height of the wheel. Over the 3 day tournament the team played in 5 games competing well against expe-

rienced opposition.
